Course Overview:

This Colposcopy Course is a one-day course suitable for trained colposcopists seeking to advance their knowledge as well as those more experienced who are wishing to gain BSCCP re-certification. **The course receives BSCCP approval.**

It is suitable for BSCCP accredited colposcopists who are intermediate to advance in their level of the knowledge and treatment of cervical premalignant disease and other lower genital tract intraepithelial neoplasia's. It reflects the latest advances in colposcopy and the NHSCSP, including the role of HPV testing, HPV vaccination, management issues as well as clinical knowledge in lower genital tract diagnoses and treatment.

In line with recent BSCCP course requirements, there will be a requirement for a degree of interactivity and a need to provide a post course reflective statement to evidence attendance and learning.

Learning Outcomes:

To provide delegates with an update on the latest advances in colposcopy and related subjects, thus enabling them to gain re-accreditation. Topics covered will allow participants to:

- Understand the possible changes to the screening programme in the future
- Understand how changes to the programme might affect colposcopy services
- Awareness of the effect of standard colposcopy practices on minority groups
- Understand the potential roles of colposcopy in reducing health inequalities
- Awareness of the effect of vaccination in the UK screening setting and how this might effect colposcopy
- Awareness of current classification of squamous and endocervical cancers and how these relate to treatment
- Awareness of difficulties in histological interpretation of cancer cases caused by sampling
- Understanding of how colposcopy training might be altered to include a more multispeciality approach
- Understanding of how modern teaching techniques might be used to supplement the teaching of colposcopy
- Understand current concepts in the diagnosis and management of VIN and VaIN.

Who may attend?

This course is not suitable for those with little or no experience in the area of colposcopy. It is suitable for those trained and practicing in colposcopy from both nursing and medical backgrounds, as well as trainees in the latter stages of their qualification who want to broaden their knowledge.

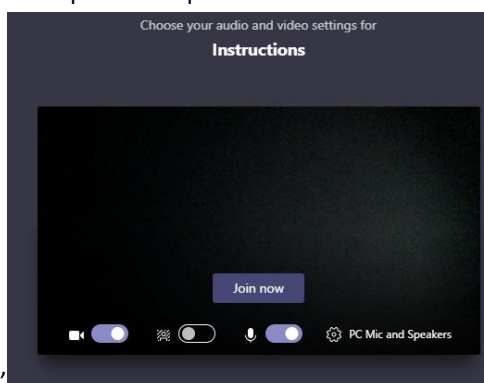
Joining Instructions – MS Teams

Using the e-mail address you provided on your NEPSEC Application Form, the NEPSEC Team will send you a calendar invite to join an MS Teams meeting for each relevant session. Please confirm you have received this by 'Accepting' each invitation.

Approximately 10 minutes prior to the meeting, scroll to the words
